Our Church had its quinquennial review in August (a review of the state of the building). The findings are being digested and will be communicated in the next newsletter. One thing we know is that the Round Tower itself is in a poor state of repair and will need significant work over the next few years. We will need to find new ways of raising money locally as well as applying for grants if we want to preserve this landmark and in turn improve the facilities to enable more community use – after all, water and some heating would be a good start!

Last winter a visiting artist created drawings of our rare 15th century pew ends, those drawings have been turned into postcards which are now on sale in Church.

In June we saw a fantastic 47% turnout, it returned five new parish councillors including Ian Kinghorn (Chair), Simon Covey and Jan Lodge who join Colin Piggott as Tuttington residents along with two Burgh residents.



Since the election, Caryl Taylor has chosen to step down as a Parish councillor, we'd like to thank her for all her service over the past 17 years.

We are aware that there have been problems trying to find the site, so recommend you type the address in full into your search engine, once you have it should pick it up on subsequent occasions.

Update from last meeting:

Highways: County Council Highways inspectors visited Tuttington during September to look at issues affecting the village. They will be returning in November so if you spot any issues (eg. Potholes or regular incidences of standing water) do let us know so we can take them forward on your behalf.

Village signs: Clive and Caryl Taylor do a great job maintaining the sign and post as well as providing and watering the hanging baskets.

The sign was painted and presented to the village by a former resident some years ago, however some residents have asked, if the funding were available, if the sign could be restored or upgraded. There is potential funding for such a project via the Tesco local grants (blue tokens) but we first need to canvas your opinion.

Speeding Traffic: We are looking at potential ways to slow traffic down through the village, a number of options are being considered but we would be interested in your views.

Neighbourhood Plan: Two of our district councillors, David Harrison and Sue Catchpole attended our meeting and gave a brief update on council matters. They have advised the Parish Council to look at forming a Neighbourhood Plan. This will be discussed at our next meeting, but if we go ahead it will need involvement from the whole community so if you are interested in getting involved then please come along to our next meeting to find out more.
